2011 RULES AND REGULATIONS / Conditions of Competition!

Kilcoy Pastoral Agricultural and Industrial Show Society is a non-profit organization and monies raised are used to provide, maintain and upgrade these amenities where possible.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY TO KILCOY SHOW GROUNDS

All persons, by entering the Showground, agree to abide by these Regulations, and any other such regulations as set by Somerset Regional Council:

1. Entry/Admission Wristbands are required to be worn at all times. Anyone identified as not in possession of official admission wristband will be requested to pay appropriate admission fee or leave the Showgrounds.
2. Kilcoy Showground is designated a "glass free" area and NO glass drink containers are permitted.
3. No liquor is to be brought into the Showgrounds.
4. The Society reserves the right to inspect containers being brought into the Showground, suspected of containing liquor.
5. Any person already under the influence of alcohol will be refused entry to the Showground.
6. Liquor must ONLY be consumed in designated licensed areas.
7. Smoking is ONLY permitted in designated areas.
8. NO liquor is to be consumed or carried in the Sideshow Area.
9. Drunken, unruly, abusive or offensive behaviour, or fighting will result in removal from the Showground and possible legal ramifications.
10. Anyone providing alcohol to a person under the age of 18 will be removed from the Showground and possible legal ramifications.
11. All directions given by authorized Staff or Security Officers must be complied with forthwith.
12. Any person directed to leave the Showground as a result of a breach of these Regulations is forthwith barred from the Showground, and any re-entry prior to the Committee lifting such barring will be deemed to be trespassing and Police will be notified.
13. The speed limit for all vehicles on the Showground is 10km/hr. Any form of reckless driving is prohibited.
14. Juveniles under 12 years must be accompanied by an adult.
15. These Rules and Regulations are imposed for the sole purpose of allowing all patrons to have an enjoyable and safe environment.

ENTRIES of EXHIBITS

1. All entries must be lodged with the Secretary, PO Box 169 Kilcoy Qld 4515 (unless otherwise stated) and will not be accepted unless accompanied by the stated entry fee on the appropriate entry form. (Please make Cheques / Money Orders payable to **Kilcoy PA&I Society** or Kilcoy Show Society).
2. Completed entry forms, together with fees, must be in the Secretary's (or Steward's) hands by the stated closing date.
3. The Society reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without giving reason for such.
4. **All** exhibitors/competitors **must** pay appropriate admission fee to the Showgrounds.

PRIZE MONEY

1. All prizes are paid on the authority of the award entered in the Judge's book/Show Schedule. When such prizes are paid, to whomsoever they are paid, the Society's responsibility ceases and no claim can afterwards be entertained.
2. Where the prizes are stated as having been donated by a person or firm, they will take the place of the Society's prizes and are not in addition to, unless expressly stated so. In the event of a tie, prize money will be shared to the value of the stated trophy.
3. In the classes where there is no competition—ie only one exhibitor, the Society reserves the right of awarding half the prize money, if they should so wish.
4. **NO PRIZE MONEY SHALL BE PAID UNTIL AFTER THE GRAND PARADE (approximately 2:30pm). Prize money may be collected from Secretary's Office.**
5. Please note - if registered for GST, you will be required to supply your own completed Tax Invoice for Prize Monies over \$50.00.

POINTS

1. Points shall be allotted as follows—First 3; Second 2; Third 1
2. Where only two entries are received—First 2; Second 1
3. Where only one entry is received—First 1, unless otherwise stated.

EXHIBITS

1. All exhibits to be the bonafide property or the work of, or grown by exhibitor. Nothing to indicate ownership of any exhibit will be permitted (usual brands on livestock excepted).
2. When display space is limited, preference is given to the prize winners.
3. No exhibits may be removed without the consent of the Stewards.
4. Pavilion exhibits must remain in place until 6pm Saturday (unless otherwise stated in Show Schedule).
5. Exhibits entered in the wrong class by the exhibitor may be transferred to the correct class by the Stewards
6. Pavilion Exhibits can be entered in one class only.

JUDGING

1. The judge need not award any prize to an exhibit that, in his or her opinion, does not comply with the regulation.
2. In the judging of livestock, all questions as to the eligibility of any exhibit with reference to age or breed shall be decided by the judge. Judging of the class may be deferred until the exhibitor has produced proof.
3. The judge may award Second Prize if the exhibit is not worthy of First, and shall not award any prize, if the exhibit is not considered of sufficient merit.

STEWARDS

1. Stewards shall attend to the reception, classification, numbering and placing of all exhibits and to all matters in connection therewith.
2. The judge to be furnished with a schedule of prizes, but no information as to the name or place of the exhibitor.
3. The Stewards shall prepare Prize Cards and ensure that these and any ribbons are properly fixed to the prize exhibits.
4. The Steward of each selection shall settle any dispute arising therein, but the Exhibitor has the privilege of lodging a written protest against the decision. This will be dealt with by the Committee whose decision shall be final.
5. All protests must be lodged with the Secretary in writing with a deposit of \$10.00, not later than half an hour after the award has been made. The deposit, in any protest considered frivolous, will be forfeited to the Society.

SOCIETY'S RESPONSIBILITIES

1. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may occur to any exhibit at the show, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Society harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any accident.
2. The Society will not, under any consideration, hold itself responsible for any loss, damage or miss-delivery of livestock or other exhibits at the Show.
3. Any prize money not claimed on Saturday, will be forfeited to the Society.
4. All Exhibitors & persons admitted to the Grounds shall be subject to the Rules, Regulations & orders of the Stewards.
5. **The Rules and Regulations, Rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies** (copy of which is available at Show Office) **and the notes set forth in this Schedule are the Conditions of Competition.**

Any matter arising, not specifically provided for in the foregoing, shall be determined by the Committee, whose decision shall be final.

6. The chief ring steward has the right to suspend anyone from competing who cannot handle his/her animal.
7. **All livestock entries must comply strictly with all protocol imposed by the Department of Primary Industries, and governing Associations.**

WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT

1. Any exhibitors and stall holders intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor in current timeframe.
2. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors and the general public, and is a requirement of the Workplace Health and Safety Act of 1995. The Act imposes severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions.
3. Any exhibitors and stall holders who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Kilcoy Show. **Exhibitors should check all electrical equipment, leads and gas bottles to ensure they meet current regulations, before entering the Showgrounds to avoid the occurrence of difficulties.**
4. All food stall holders are reminded of their obligations to comply with all relevant State and Local Government Regulations and requirements.

2011 LIST OF BANNED ITEMS AT AGRICULTURAL SHOWS

Drug Related Goods (including Cocaine Kits, Bongs etc.), Explicit and Hardcore T-Shirts, Fake Cigarettes, Fireworks – Crackers, Fuel type Fire Lighters (Zippo), Horns and Trumpets, Knives (including Pen Knives), Laser Pointers, Metal and wooden Martial Art Nunchakas, Playing Cards (nude or lurid), Pressure Pack Snow, Silly String, Stink Bombs, Bouncing Beans, Shang-hi/sling shots, and Bomb Bags.

Toy Guns are acceptable, however the following are not:-

Ball Bearing Guns, Eight Shot Caps, Pellet Guns, Pop Downs (Throw Downs), Potato Guns, Replica Guns (bullet type), Roll Caps, Strip Caps, and Water Pistols over 150mm (6").
